



Who can come? The camp is open to any student who will enter Grades 4 and up in the fall of 2020. Evergreen Park residency not required.

What is the schedule? The camp will meet Monday-Friday from 9 a.m.—3 p.m. from June 15th through July 10th. There will be no camp on July 3rd or 6th for the Independence Day holiday. Performances will take place on July 9th at 7 p.m. and July 10th at 10 a.m.

What's the show? This year's production is "The Lion King, Jr. Experience". Need I say more? Lots of characters to bring to life!

What will the kids do during camp? Campers will receive music, dance, and acting instruction as they prepare for their performances. They will also assemble their own props for the show.

Who will be working with the campers? Amy Kazin is the director of the camp. She is on the fine arts staff at EPCHS and has been directing shows there since 2000. Students will also interact with other community theater veterans and EPCHS theater alumni and students.

What is the cost and what does it include? The cost of the camp is \$200 for Evergreen Park residents and \$225 for non-residents. Tuition includes 3 weeks of instruction, the student script/workbook for the production, a show t-shirt and a post-show cast party on July 10th

Are there any other hidden costs? Tickets for the production itself will be \$5 for adults and \$4 for children and seniors. Campers will need basic clothing to serve as a costume for the show, depending upon their character.
